ELEMENTARY AND SECONDARY REPORT 2012-2013

The Algonquins of Pikwàkanagàn First Nation students are bussed to provincial schools off the First Nation except for children attending Day Care. Our students attend St. James School, Eganville District Public School, Opeongo High School and Bishop Smith High School. The enrollment of First Nation students is specified below:

LITERACY, NUMERACY AND MATH ACHIEVEMENTS

Our Algonquins of Pikwàkanagàn First Nation students attend provincial schools off the First Nation. The subject areas of literacy, numeracy and math achievements are provided by each school. We do however; provide an Afterschool Tutoring Program to assist our students with academics, social and interaction skills.

STUDENT RETENTION, ATTENDANCE AND GRADUATION RATE ACHIEVEMENTS

The Algonquins of Pikwàkanagàn First Nation hosts career fairs, graduation ceremonies and provides academic scholarships and incentives to our students to increase student retention, attendance and graduation achievements. Our graduates are honoured at our graduation ceremonies.

The First Nation has support staff in the schools to assist our students i.e. Educational Assistants, Native Liaison Worker, Native School Support Counsellors and Native Language Teacher. The numbers of First Nation students attending school off the First Nation fluctuates from year to year which affects our number of graduates in elementary and secondary levels.

Our day care numbers are also affected by the number of First Nation children from ages 18 months to 6 years of age who enroll in the program.
